BOWLS REPORT

1. ENGLAND UNDER 25 INTERNATIONAL SERIES – COUNTY PLAYERS INVOLVED.

The British Isles Indoor Bowling Council's Junior Men's International Series was held at Aberdeen IBC on the weekend of 16th/17th February, 2019, and 3 County players were representing their country.

Connor Cinato, Kingsthorpe BC Indoor – a regular International now, and he had the honour of being **England's Captain** for this Series.

Danny Walker, Wellingborough BC Indoor, retaining his International place.

Adam Pitfield, Wellingborough BC Indoor – making his International Debut at this level.

Connor skipped a rink which comprised Oliver Fowler of Rugby Thornfield IBC at Lead, Glen Williams, of Riverain IBC at No. 2 and **Danny Walker** at No. 3.

Adam played at No. 2 in a rink skipped by Jordan Philpott of Spalding IBC, and he had with him Glen Adams of Herga IBC at Lead and James Hampton of Exonia IBC, who was also making his debut, at No. 3.

The **first match** for **England** was against **Scotland** on the morning of the 16th February, 2019, and after a very tight match indeed, England won 77-74 shots. England had 2 winning rinks and 2 losing rinks, and **Connor & Danny's rink**, the highest scoring in winning by a very good 14 shots, at 25-11, carried the overall victory. **Adam's rink** lost by just 3 shots at 17-20 shots.

The **second match** for **England** was against **Ireland** on the afternoon of the 16th February, 2019, and here the England team had an easier victory by 22 shots at 78-56 shots, with 3 winning rinks. This time, in a very tight match indeed, **Connor** and his men just lost by 1 shot at 15-16 shots, but **Adam** and his men had a very good 11 shots win at 21-10 shots, this being the highest scoring for England.

The **third**, and last match for **England**, was against **Wales** on the morning of the 17th February, 2019, and a win here would cement the Championship for England, a draw would make it dependent on shots difference, but a loss would give the title to Wales. Unfortunately England lost the match by 8 shots, and therefore came 2nd in the Series. **Connor's rink** drew 23 shots each and **Adam's rink** lost by just a single shot 19-20 shots. One of the other rinks also drew, and the 4th rink lost by 5 shots.

Nevertheless, well done to the County players who represented their country in this International Series.

2. DISABILITY BOWLS ENGLAND – COUNTY BOWLERS INVOLVEMENT.

Disability Bowls England held its Open Pairs competition recently at Solihull IBC, and two County players were involved.

Kieran Rollings, Kettering Lodge BC was paired with the well known DBE bowler and England Captain Bob Love, and **Steve Bigg of Wellingborough BC** was paired with Alex Comack

Unfortunately both County men lost their first matches, Bob & Kieran to Mac Otton & Gary Swift, and Alex & Steve to Jonathan Stokes & Dave Fisher, but this qualified them to play in the 'Plate Competition

Plate Competition – for 1st Round losers.

Bob Love & Kieran Rollings dominated their way to the final beating Mark Cooper & Tim Swann and then Alex Comack & **Steve Bigg**. The **Plate Final** started as a tight affair but slowly the class of **Bob Love & Kieran Rollings** shone through and they beat Craig Bowler & Joe Peplow 14-7 shots

3. NORTHAMPTONSHIRE MEN 'MIDLAND COUNTIES' versus BEDFORDSHIRE – RESULT

The men of the **Northamptonshire Indoor Bowling Association** entertained their counterparts from Bedfordshire to a Midland Counties match on Saturday, 16th February, 2019, at Northampton & District IBA, and with a 100% record of rink wins, took the match comfortably by 57 shots. The highest scoring rink for the County was that skipped by Andy Smith which recorded a very impressive 25 shots win.

The Final score was Northamptonshire 136 shots – Bedfordshire 79 shots.

As the final score suggests, this was a pretty tight affair, with the County just in front 5-3 after 5 ends, and 8-7 at 10 ends, but Beds won the next 3 ends with successive doubles for a 13-8 lead. 3 ends later the scores were level at 13 shots each with 5 ends to play, and it was anyone's match, as the scores were level at 15 each after 18 ends, and 16 each with 1 end left. A single on the last end gave John and his men the slender win.

Rink 2. Roger Summers, Dougie Ainsworth, Curtis Johnson & Will Walker 23 shots – J Allen 15 shots

A match in which the County was 3-4 down after 5 ends, but after collecting a count of 3 on the next end they got their nose in front and stayed there with leads of 10-6 at 10 ends of play, 16-10 at 15 ends, and with 3 ends to play, Will and his rink were 9 shots up at 20-11. Beds did reduce their deficit a little in picking up 4 shots to 3 conceded in those last 3 ends, but it was a decent win for the County.

Rink 3. James Robinson, Richard Somerton, Jason Bryan & Chris Bland 21 shots - S Proctor 17 shots

In this encounter the County was just 3-4 adrift after 5 ends, but Beds scored well over the next 5 ends for a 11-4 shots lead, the reaction to which by Chris & his men was to pick up a single on the next end and then a massive 6 count to tie the match at 11 shots. The scores were still level at 13 each with 7 ends left, and 14 shots each with 5 to play, and in collecting 5 shots on the next 2 ends Chris and his men looked favourites for the win and they duly did so in collecting 2 shots to 3 conceded over the last 3 ends.

Rink 4. Tony Dicks, David Flippance, Cameron Knox & Andy Smith 30 shots – L Bowes 5 shots

This match started spectacularly well for the County as the rink picked up a 5 on the first end and followed it with a 4 and a single for a 10-0 lead after 3 ends. Then followed 7 very tight ends where just 1 shot was scored on each with 5 of them to the County, for a 15-2 shots lead after 10 ends of play. Beds were then kept on that score for the next 8 ends as Andy and his men added 13 shots for a 28-2 lead with 3 ends to play. Beds won 2 of those ends, but the County's win was quite dominant, allowing their opponents to win just 4 of the 21 ends.

Rink 5. Will Clelland, Peter Mellor, Norman Gibb & Richard Mann 28 shots – M Curtis 14 shots

In this match Beds started off a little better than the County with them holding a 4-3 lead after 5 ends, but that lead was very short lived as Richard and his men collected a big 5, followed by a 2, for a 10-4 lead and in the next 5 ends they added 6 shots whilst conceding 3 to increase their lead to 16-7. On the 15th end Beds collected a decent count of 4 shots, but Richard and his men reciprocated with a 4 of their own on the next end and followed it with a single for a 23-12 lead with 4 ends left. 5 more shots for the County and 2 shots conceded, saw Richard getting a very good win.

Rink 6. Dougie Cooper, Kieran Rollings, George Warren & Darren Childs 17 shots – D Whelan 12 shots

In this encounter the County rink started much the better, scoring 7 shots on the first 4 ends for no return, but over the next 6 ends Beds outscored Darren and his men to reduce their deficit to 6-9 shots. After 16 ends the lead for the County was still reasonable at 15-9 shots, but Beds won the next 3 ends, albeit with just singles to close the gap to just 3 shots, and the County collected 2 singles for the modest win.

The BDA recently opened a new application window for its Club Development Programme and it has changed the criteria, allowing for any clubs with a net membership decline of over 3% in the past 2 years to apply, and the BDA has provided a lot of additional information to support clubs before making a decision whether to apply.
