Neil McKee, Kingsthorpe BC will play at No. 2 on a rink skipped by Jamie Chestney of Exonia IBC, and they will have Martin Spencer of Spalding at Lead, and David Bolt of South Shields IBC at No. 3.

First up for England is Ireland which will be played at 10.0 a.m. on Thursday, the 14th, and that will be followed by the match against Wales at 3.0 p.m. on Friday, 15th, and lastly the match against Scotland scheduled for 3.0 p.m. on Saturday, 16th.

3. DISABILITY BOWLS ENGLAND –SINGLES TOURNAMENT INVOLVING COUNTY PLAYERS

The weekend of Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd March, 2019, featured the **Disability Bowls England (DBE)** National Classified Singles Championship for 2019 at Gedling Indoor Bowls Club, Nottingham. 28 bowlers travelled from the four corners of the Nation to compete in this most prestigious event, and in its number two County players were featured – **Steve Bigg, Wellingborough BC** and **Kieran Rollings, Kettering Lodge BC**, the 2018 DBE Player of the Year

Each bowler competed against others from the same Disability Classification, and competition was tough and at the end of the first day Paul Brown lead the B6's, Bob Love - B7/1's, Steve Ireland and Jonathan Stokes were level in B7/2's, Dylan Morton in the lead in the B8/1's and **Kieran Rollings**, in the lead in the B8/2's.

Kieran and Dylan Morton contested the B8 Final and the match lived up to the high standard we had come to expect. Dylan crept into a five shot lead, the pressure increased with **Kieran** pulling back to draw level and then taking a slender lead before finally winning 18-15 shots and therefore taking the Category B8 title.

The battle for these fantastic trophies continued early Sunday morning and the standard of bowls just got better and better as the day progressed. Due to numbers, B6 entrants played on a round robin basis and the winner being made the Champion. At the start of the finals, B6 group matches continued with Paul Brown leading the group on 8 points and he was playing his last game against Ray Smith,

At the bell for the last end of **Steve Bigg, Wellingborough BC**, versus Joe Peplow for the chance of the B6 title, they were tied at 12-12, the umpire was called after all bowls had been delivered, to measure.....Joe took shot by one-quarter of an inch, giving him a 13-12 win and tying the B6 Group, with Paul Brown, on 8 points. It was now down to Maggy Smith, DBE Secretary, to calculate the shot difference. To everyone's surprise the shot difference was only *one* better and in favour of Joe, what a fantastic finish to a brilliant tournament, no one could have predicted such an ending.

5. NORTHAMPTONSHIRE MEN – PRESIDENT’S CHARITY MATCH – RESULT

President John Haines, Desborough IBC held the annual **President’s Charity** match on Wednesday, 6th March, 2019, at his Club, and a total of 48 male County bowlers took part, including players from all the County Indoor Clubs except Kingsthorpe BC. They were organised into two teams, the Red Team and the White Team, with the President captaining the White Team and **Vice President Colin Barnes, Northampton & District IBA** captaining the Red Team.

At the conclusion of a most enjoyable and entertaining match the White Team won by 28 shots. The highest scoring rink for the White Team was the one skipped by County Team Manager Matt Pownall, which posted a 14 shots win, although not far behind with 3 shots less was the rink skipped by Bob Tingle, and the highest scoring for the Red Team, and the only winning rink was the rink skipped by Tony Weston, with a 5 shots win.

After just 9 shots scored on the first 8 ends, with the White team ahead 6-3, Matt and his players ‘bucked the trend’ and scored 10 shots on the next 3 ends for a decent 16-3 lead, and after Dave and his men doubled their score on the next end, Matt went further ahead 24-6 with 5 ends to play. Those 5 ends went 8-4 in Dave’s favour but it was a decent win for the White Team.

This was another very tight match with just 7 shots scored on the first 7 ends with the Red Team just in front 4-3, but then the White team picked up a 3 and a 4 to go ahead 11-4, and after 15 ends they were further ahead at 16-7, but the next 4 ends belonged to Terry and his men as they closed the gap to just 2 shots at 14-16 down with 2 ends left. Those 2 ends produced 2 single shots for Richard and his men for a modest win.

Green Inspectors Required.

“Bowls Northamptonshire requires bowling green inspectors for the grading of greens throughout the county.

Training will be provided and when trained you work within a team of 2 inspectors.

The time required to complete the inspections is about 2 hours per day for each club green.

The inspections would ideally start at the end of May start of June.

Travelling expenses are paid for each journey.

A schedule of inspections will be provided to each team to organise and complete the gradings on each green.

The first meeting for the 2019 season will be on 14th March 2019 @ Northampton West End B.C. 10'clock start.
