2. BOWLS NORTHMPTONSHIRE UPDATE AND PREVIEW OF NEW OUTDOOR SEASON

The new season for the **Jackson Grundy sponsored Bowls Northamptonshire** is now underway, and everyone is looking forward to all the challenges of competition, and the enjoyment of the sport outdoors, with the hope that last year's glorious bowling weather might be repeated! An update of the organisation, and a review of the forthcoming matches and competitions would help in keeping everyone informed, so here goes:

Officers for 2019.

The **Executive Committee** is largely unchanged, with John Chester, Chairman; Jan Hunt, Administrator; Ken Court, Treasurer; Alison Dring, Assistant Treasurer; and Brenice Willmott, Women's Section Secretary, all continuing in their roles.

They are, however, joined by the **2019 Women's President Elaine Munton, of Northampton Whyte Melville BC**. Elaine was Senior Vice President for the Women's Section in 2018, and has played and supported the County for a number of years. In the absence of a Men's Section Secretary and President this year, Kevin Mawson, Kislingbury BC and BN Yearbook Editor, and Richard Somerton, Brackley & District BC and BN Men's Match Secretary, have been co-opted to the Executive.

The **Women's Section Management Committee** is also largely unchanged, with President Elaine Munton being joined by Vice President Yvonne McKee, Kingsthorpe BC; Marlene Armitage, Wellingborough BC, Immediate Past President; Brenice Willmott, Irchester BC, Secretary; Alison Dring, Burton Latimer Town BC, Treasurer; Jan Hunt, Wellingborough BC, Competition Secretary & Heather Lack, Burton Latimer Town BC, Match Secretary

The Men's Section Management Committee is currently without a President, Immediate Past President and Secretary, but it is very good news that Paul Green, Northampton Express BC has been nominated by his Club, and appointed to the post of Men's Section Vice President for 2019, with the expectation that he will be President in 2020. Paul has been involved with Bowls for a number of years, as a player and officer of his Club, and he has supported the County by playing in many matches in recent years. He had his appointment confirmed at the Bowls Northamptonshire Council Meeting last week, and he was presented with his Vice President's Badge by the Chairman, John Chester. The remaining membership of the Men's Management Committee is largely unchanged.

2019 Inter County Competitions

The role of **Team Manager for the Women's Section's Walker Cup & Johns Trophy** continues to be held by **Jan Hunt**, and that of Team Manager for the **Amy Rose Under 31 Trophy** continues under the hand of **Velda Cooper**, **Irchester BC**. The first Johns Trophy match will be played on **Saturday**, **1**st **June**, **2019**, against Essex at Wellingborough BC with matches against Suffolk (away), Cambridgeshire (at Wellingborough BC) and Huntingdonshire (away) to follow. The Walker Cup is a knock out competition and the first match, and hopefully not the last, is on **Sunday**, **23**rd **June**, **2019**, against Cambridgeshire at Wellingborough BC. The Any Rose competition is played on the **31**st **August**, **2019**, at the end of the National Championships at Royal Leamington Spa

The role of **Team Manager for the Men's Section Middleton Cup, Midland Counties BA & the Balcomb Trophy**, is with the newly appointed **Mick Smith, of Leicestershire.** Mick had his appointment confirmed at last week's Bowls Northamptonshire Council meeting, and Vice President Paul Green's first function was to present Mick with his County Badge. Mick is a very highly respected bowler, having played over 200 competitive matches for Leicestershire, and having featured in numerous competition finals in his home County, playing at National Championships as a result. He held a meeting for potential players on Thursday last, and it is clear how passionate and excited he is on taking up this management role. He has appointed Mick Sharpe of Kingsthorpe BC as his assistant, and Andrew Manton, Kingsthorpe BC as the Team Captain. We all wish him and his team, all the very best of fortune, and the best support that he could ask for by the players.

The County is holding a Trial at Kingsthorpe BC on **Saturday**, **4**th **May**, **2019**, a Middleton Cup Practice match against Oxfordshire on **Saturday**, **11**th **May**, **2019**, both at Kingsthorpe BC, with the first competitive match, a **Midland Counties** game against Derbyshire on **Saturday**, **18**th **May**, **2019**, at Long Eaton Town BC, followed by matches against Lincolnshire (away), Warwickshire (away), Nottinghamshire (at Wellingborough BC), Worcestershire (at Bugbrooke BC) and Leicestershire (at Wellingborough BC). The first **Middleton Cup** match will be against Norfolk on Saturday 1st June, 2019 at County Arts BC, Norwich, with matches against Leicestershire (last year's national winners – at Kingsthorpe BC), Cambridgeshire (at Kingsthorpe BC) and Hertfordshire (away) to follow.

The role of **Junior Team Manager for the County Under 25's** continues to be held by **Jason Bryan, Kingsthorpe BC**, in which role he is responsible for both genders in his friendly matches against other opposition, and for male members in the inter county **White Rose Trophy**, a trophy which we were all delighted when his team won the title in 2018, and we wish him and his team all the best for a repeat.

County Friendly Matches

Nancie Colling, MBE, celebrates 100th Birthday

Nancie Colling, MBE, widely respected within women's bowls both on the green and in an administrative capacity, celebrated her Centenary at the weekend. She is a three-time national singles champion, winning the title in 1956, 1958 and 1970, in addition to securing the Two-Wood Singles title in 1965. She was an international for 15 seasons between 1957 and 1978, before increasing her involvement off the green.

Nancie held the position of Assistant Secretary of the English Women's Bowling Association in 1978 and 1979, before becoming Secretary in 1980 – a position she held until 2002. She was the England team manager at the third Women's World Bowls Championships in Worthing in 1977 and subsequently managed the team at further World Championships and Commonwealth Games. She was respected across the World and succeeded in ensuring Women's Bowls was taken seriously at a time when sport for women frequently struggled to attract attention.

Nancie became President of Women's World Bowls in 1995 for a period of three years, with 1996 seeing the Women's World Bowls Championships staged at Victoria Park, Royal Leamington Spa. She was the inspiration behind the team of volunteers who delivered a very successful event with a spectator capacity of 3,000. Attendances were outstanding with capacity crowds on a number of days with all Finals televised.

The EWBA National Championships were staged at Leamington whilst Nancie was Secretary, during which time she developed a very close, mutually advantageous relationship with Warwick District Council which continues to this day. She was awarded an MBE for her services to women's bowls in 1996.

Nancie is held in great affection by so many people in our sport across the world, and at a party held on Saturday April 20th to celebrate her 100th Birthday, she was surrounded by 27 members of her family in addition to friends from across the whole spectrum of her life.

Women's Senior International Team Manager

Later in her life Kingsthorpe BC was Judy's 'second home' and she felt great comfort at being in the club amongst her friends, both bowling and socially. Judy leaves 2 sons, Robert and Edward.
