BOWLS REPORT

1. NORTHAMPTONSHIRE MEN 'MIDDLETON CUP' PRACTICE MATCH versus OXON

The Men's Section of the **Jackson Grundy sponsored Bowls Northamptonshire** played what has become a traditional 'Middleton Cup' practice match against Oxfordshire on Saturday, 11th May, 2019, on the excellent greens at Kingsthorpe BC, and as is always the case a well contested match gave the Team Manager, Mick Smith and his Assistant Mick Sharpe, a good opportunity to view the players who, for the majority, are likely to help form his season's squad for the Midland Counties campaign, and the more important 'Middleton Cup' matches later.

Mick fielded 26 players, 4 of whom played half of the match, and he made one positional change too, and the County was greatly encouraged by the win by 14 shots. Rink wins were shared at 3 each, and the highest scoring for the County was that skipped by the County Team Captain, Andrew Manton, which posted a very good win by 19 shots.

The final score was Northamptonshire 130 shots – Oxfordshire 116 shots. Rink details as follows, Oxon skips only:

The County men had a pretty decent start to this match and held a 6-3 shots lead after 5 ends of play, but then Oxon pegged them on that 6 for 5 ends whilst they scored 10 shots for a 13-6 lead at 10 ends. Oxon continued to score well and after 15 ends Paul and his men were 8-21 shots in deficit, but in winning 4 of the last 6 ends the County men much reduced their deficit to just 8 shots in the end.

This match started very well for the Oxon men as they posted 7 shots without reply in 3 ends, and an 8-2 lead after 5 ends, but the County men had a good run of ends, starting with a 4 on the 6th end, and after 12 ends they had taken a 14-10 shots lead. Oxon tied things up at 14 each, and with 5 ends to play it was once again level at 15 each, and, after 20 ends, again level at 19 shots each, but Oxon managed to take a single for their small win.

A pretty even start with the scores level on 4 shots each after 4 ends, but then the County men collected a big count of 5 to take a good lead 9-4, and when picking up a 4 on the 8th end Vernon and his men had a 13-7 shots lead. They say that 13 is unlucky for some, and it certainly was for the County for they were stuck on 13 for 5 ends, as Oxon picked up 8 shots to take the lead 15-13. The County immediately hit back with a 4 and after 18 ends had got themselves a 4 shots lead at 21-17, and were able to hang on for the 2 shots win.

Rink 4. David Iddles (replaced by Danny Walker after 10 ends), Sam Gamble, David Walker & Connor Cinato 20 shots – A J Docherty 23 shots

In this match Oxon started off just a little better and after 5 ends had a lead at 8-6, thanks to a 5 collected on the 4th end, and 5 ends later lead by just 1 more shot at 12-9, and after 14 ends still just 3 ahead at 15-12. End 15 was not good for the County as Oxon picked up another big count of 5 shots to lead 20-12, but Connor and his men were spurred on to win the next 4 ends to tie things up at 20 shots each with 2 ends to play. Unfortunately for the County both those ends went the way of the visitors.

7. BOWLS MAINTENANCE SEMINAR

A 'Greens Maintenance' seminar was held on Wednesday 8th May 2019 at Northampton West End BC on behalf of Bowls Northamptonshire for all the bowls clubs in the county.

There were 40 delegates representing 22 clubs from Northamptonshire with presentations from Symbio Finbarr Madden giving a talk on Turf Biology, Chris Humphrey from Collier Turf Care covering the subjects of Grass Seeds, Fungicides and Worm & Control. Harry Larkins from Turfmaster gave a short presentation on the Air 2G2 system and then a demonstration on the green on how the Air 2G2 machine works.

Also, in attendance was Dennis/Sisis who demonstrated a wide range of equipment and how to set up a mower cut height and the cutting edge of the mower blade. They also demonstrated the Sisis Dart and the Dennis Mower cassette range of mowers.

Bowls England Urges Players to stay 'Sun Safe' this Summer

Stay safe in the sun this summer – that's the message from Bowls England as clubs across the country open their doors for the start of the 2019 season. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the UK, with a particularly sharp rise in the number of cases since the 1970s. Sports and hobbies that see people outside in the sun tend to increase the risk of excessive sun exposure, which can cause premature skin ageing, sun damage and skin cancer. The good news is that skin cancer is largely preventable, and with proper practices can be detected early and successfully treated.

Tony Allcock MBE, Bowls England Chief Executive, said: "A typical British summer doesn't always give us the weather and glorious sunshine that perhaps we'd hope for. It can therefore be easy to overlook the need for sun protection in England. If you're going to be outside playing bowls this summer, it's important to remember to protect yourself from the sun. In an ideal world, you should avoid being outside between 11am and 3pm on days when the UV forecast is high. If that's not feasible, then make sure you have plenty of sun protection."

The **British Association of Dermatologists** advises that you should be looking for:

- New skin lumps, spots, ulcers, scaly patches or moles that weren't there before
- Marks (including moles) on the skin that have changed shape, colour, texture or size
- Sores that do not heal
- Any areas on the skin that are itchy, painful or bleed

If there are moles that you want to keep an eye on then it's a good idea to take a picture of them, preferably with something, such as a coin, for scale. This will be a good reference point so that you can easily tell if there have been any changes. If in doubt, get it checked out by your GP.
